DRAMATURG'S NOTE

As a life-long theatre-lover, performing artist, and storyteller, I was thrilled to be invited to join the creative team of Turnover: A New Leaf as the show's dramaturg. When first diving into this story, I immediately knew it was special. Turnover brilliantly explores family dynamics, prejudice, and trauma through the lives of plants. In the show, we are planted into the complex lives of garden-dwelling characters who are each addressing their pasts and mending their relationships with each other, all while growing individually. Researching botanical terms, social trends, and the landscape that this story takes place in was an enriching experience. With every biological reference, environmental play on words, and each masterful lyric, I was further inspired by David's dynamic, virtuosic writing and Aliyah's vision and thoughtful construction of the story. I'm grateful to be a part of this piece of theater and excited for audiences to join Parsley, Pyrus, Rau, and Malus on their journey, and maybe learn a new thing or two about botany (I know I did!) - Bryson Lima

After studying dramatic writing, she was accepted into Horizon Theatre Company's New South Young Playwrights Contest and Festival, which contributed to her being a Third Annual Dramatists Guild of America Young Playwright Award semi-finalist. Since then, she received the 2020-2022 Rosalind Ayres-Williams Scholarship at Working Title Playwrights. Her first commission came with Pillow Talk, an auditory experience developed by and premiered on Alliance Theatre Anywhere, Spotlight Studio in 2021. Most recently, she was a 2023 member of the Exquisite Corpse Company's Spring Writer's Lab, culminating in a reading of a new oneact play at Culture Lab LIC. When not writing, she directs, stage manages, and collaborates with fellow theatermakers. Aliyah also makes films, photographs, poetry, and has dance parties with her nieces.

VERONICA DANG [she/her] (Rau Ram) is an actress/writer/director/comedian and creator of acclaimed web series, Subway: The Series. 



NEW MUSICALS FESTIVAL DEVELOPMENTAL PROCESS

(September 2023 — March 17, 2024)

September 21: Application

Theatre on the Verge posted a call for musicals on their Facebook page @TheatreontheVerge. David initially submitted his space family drama, *Ellipses*.

October 12: Meeting with Amanda Gulla

David decided to switch his priorities to his plant-based family drama, Turnover.

November 10: Acceptance

"Hello David, We at Theatre on the Verge would like to formally offer your musical "Turnover: a New Leaf" a spot in our 2024 New Musicals Festival. Should you accept, your show would be scheduled for a 90 minute time slot on one day of the festival in person at the Abington Art Center."

November 15: Aliyah and David are Director-Writer Partners Again

Aliyah Curry and David were respectively the scholar and apprentice in 2020 and 2021 of Working Title Playwrights, Atlanta. Aliyah directed the concert reading of David's apprenticeship project, *Ellipses*. Aliyah and David moved to New York City soon after. They were the featured artists on the Undiscovered Countries show in September 2023, where Aliyah featured her play *What's a Berry* (featuring Raven Jeannette) and David featured an excerpt of *Turnover* (featuring Maria Noriko Cabral, Tuânminh Albert Đỗ, Xiaoxiao Sun, and Erick Carter).



November 15 - December 2: Assembling the Team

Amanda connected the team to stage manager Maya Nguyen-Haberneski and music director Matthew Melchior, Lantern Theatre Company apprentices in Philadelphia.

Aliyah brought in Bryson Lima as the dramaturg. Bryson and Aliyah worked together respectively as director-writer and stage manager on Bryson's play Superdollar at New York Theatre Festival.

October 5 - January 14: Casting

TOTV posted audition notices on social media and Google Form. TOTV received over a hundred applicants. The creative team had three meetings centered on this.

November 5 - March 17: Dramaturgy Meetups with Bryson Lima

The book stayed consistently at 54 pages with Bryson Lima's dramaturgical feedback. It took three online sessions.

Bryson performed heavy research on the 2010s culture, transformative characterizations, and societal themes. He created audience questions for feedback and helped draft up a botanical reference guide for the musical.

<u>December - February: Songwriting</u>

In December, David completed the songs "Photosynthesis" and "Dirt on You." In January to February for his musical *The Seasoned Veteran*, David wrote Zima's song "Head in the Clouds" which is now integrated into *Turnover* as "Fig Leaf."

From rehearsal notes and musician's feedback, David reorchestrated several songs to help the performers sing and musicians play with ease.

On February 24, Michael Radi hosted a workshop for Theatre on the Verge participants where David presented "A Natural" and "Amount to Anything."

February 19 - March 4: Assembling the Orchestra

Following a Queer Big Apple Corps Symphony's 2/19 rehearsal, trombonist David got in touch with French horn player Joshua Erickson. Joshua had expressed interest in being a pianist for David's musicals since QBAC's 2023 holiday concert.

On February 21, Amanda reached out with an interest from the Philly-based guitarist-bassist Mark Rascati. On March 4, Mark Rascati connected the team to another guitarist, Frank L. Turner Jr.




